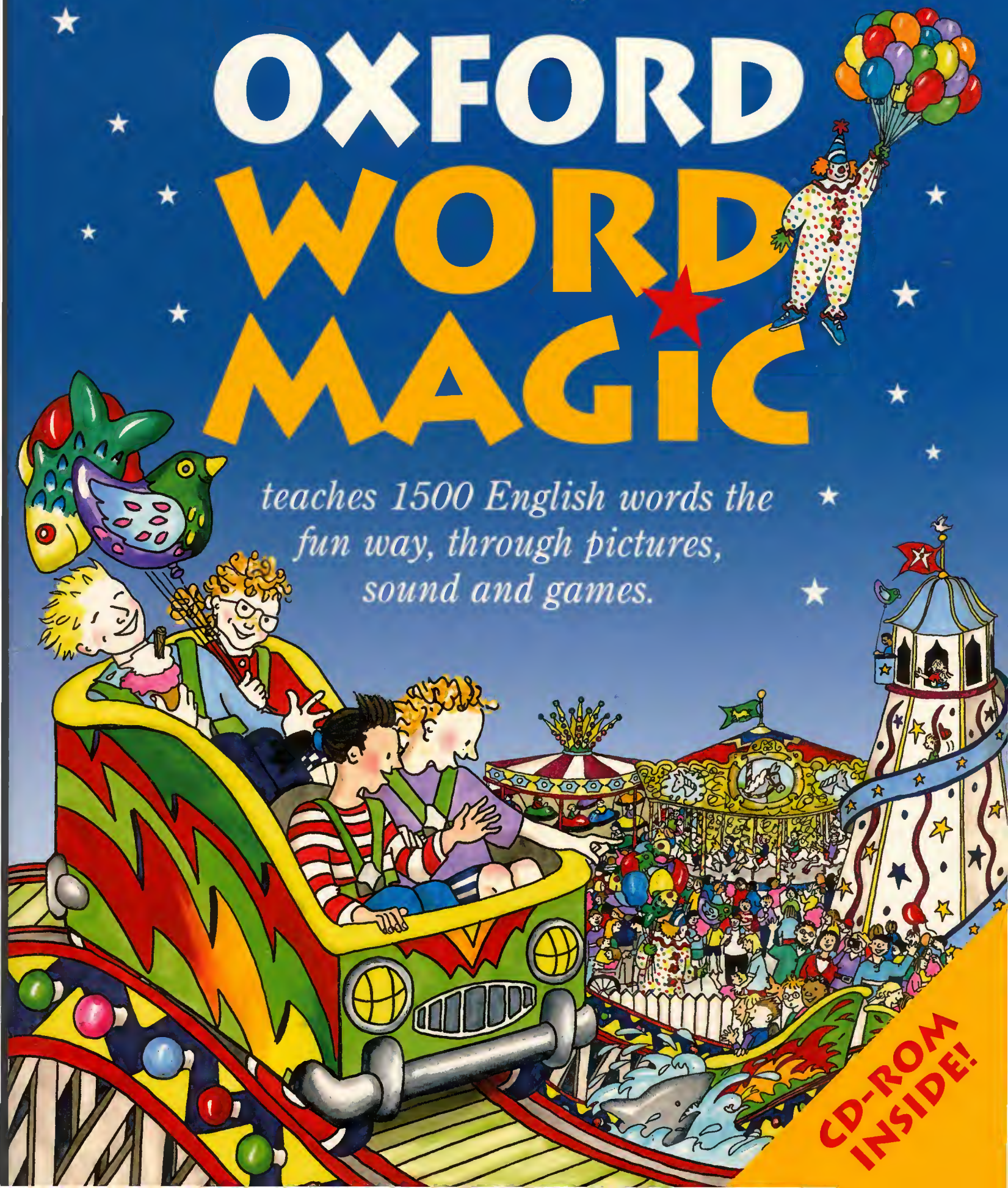

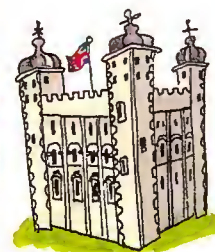

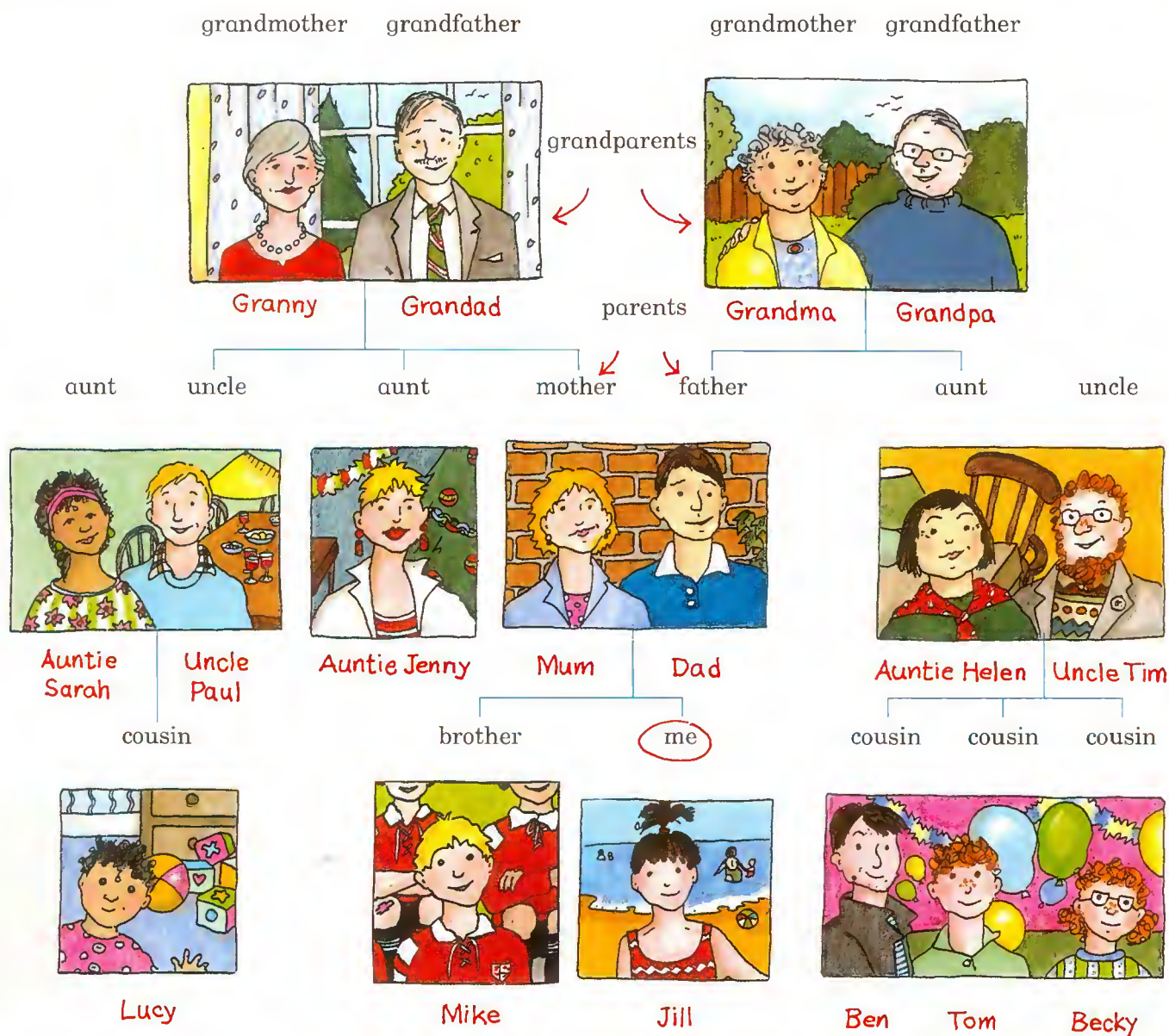
Jill I have one brother, two parents, four grandparents, three aunts, two uncles, and four cousins. My brother's called Mike. We call our parents Mum and Dad.

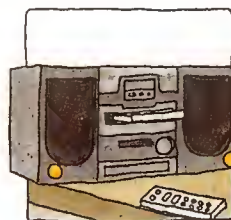
It's Mike's birthday. He is ten today and he's having a party in the garden. There are streamers, balloons, and lights in the trees.

Old envelopes, paper, and newspapers are recycled. John is not putting the magazines in the bin. He is collecting them for his dentist.

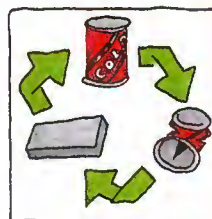

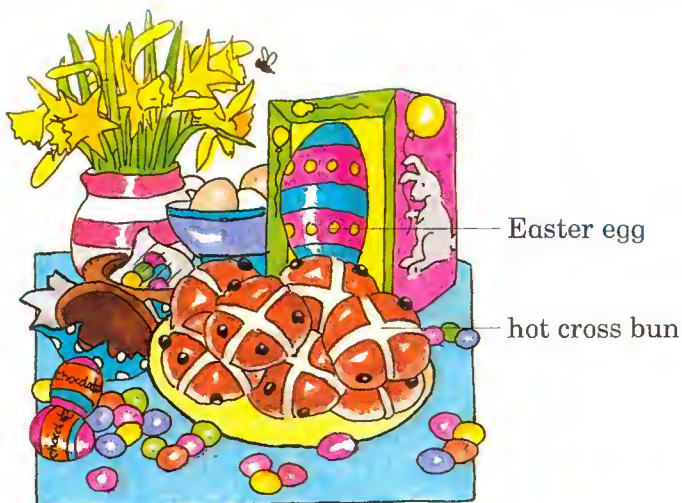
Saint Valentine's Day: 14 February
